Perspectives on "Resolutions"

- PJM's governing documents do not define every word used by stakeholders – nor should it. (other examples include "workshops" or "Grid 20/20s")
- While rare, the MC has been asked to approve a resolution which purports to represent an option to demonstrate the "will of the PJM membership".
- PJM Manual 34 does not address resolutions. IF stakeholders wish to define resolutions you will find a simple alternative proposal on the next few slides that was discussed as part of the PJM Stakeholder process forum.

Compromise Proposal

- Resolutions are "a formal expression of opinion, will, or intent voted by an official body or assembled group"*
- Proposed use by PJM stakeholders: to provide public expression, statement, or guidance from Members to PJM (Staff and Board).
- The PJM Board and Staff may, at their discretion, consider the substance of the resolution as well as both the level of support for the resolution in evaluating policy.

Compromise Proposal

- Simple definition should be included in Manual 34
 - Resolutions are a formal expression of opinion, will, or guidance from PJM Members, or subgroup of Members, who endorse them.
- Key aspects of Resolutions (also included in Manual 34)
 - Resolutions are non-binding and non-actionable expression of the Members brought to the Members Committee. (informational and/or an expression of opinion).
 - A member level vote is taken.
 - There should NOT be a voting threshold. However, a full voting record will be provided.
 - Resolutions can be used for a variety of purposes (e.g. Ceremonial or items with urgency).

Next Steps

If this proposal is endorsed, draft governing document(s) language would be presented to the Membership for approval at a future MC Meeting.
