Interconnection Process Reform

Interconnection New Service requests have drastically increased over the past few years. The Interconnection Process Reform Task Force (IPRTF) will discuss challenges related to the interconnection process and look for opportunities to improve the process via the Consensus Based Issue Resolution (CBIR) process.

Problem Statement

Problem Statement/Issue Charge approved at Planning Committee on April 6, 2021

Issue Status

The IPRTF is working on solution packages for a new interconnection process and solution packages to determine how PJM will transition to a new process.

Target Completion

The IPRTF is expected to be completed in the first quarter of 2022.

Progress Update

The transition packages were voted at the Planning Committee (PC) on Tuesday, February 8, 2022. An additional package, Interconnection Customer (IC) Coalition was provided for consideration to the PC; this package did not come though the IPRTF.

The PJM packaged was endorsed and will be the main motion at the MRC.

Here are the voting results:

National Grid Renewables	6 (3%)	200 (97%)	48
IC Coalition	69 (34%)	134 (66%)	51

The new process and transition packages, along with the OATT language updates, will be brought to the March 23, 2022 MRC for a first read.
