



**Resource Adequacy Senior Task Force (RASTF)
Monthly Progress Report
3/20/2023**

The PJM Board issued a letter on February 24, 2023 initiating the Critical Issue Fast Path (CIFP) process to resolve resource adequacy and reliability issues. On February 28 and March 15 the RASTF reviewed the letter, the CIFP work plan and draft CIFP stage 1 documentation (draft problem statement, draft issue charge and draft initial PJM proposal), and drew other RASTF issues to a point where the RASTF could enter hiatus pending completion of the CIFP process.

<p>Process</p> <p>Stage 1 – Similar to the normal CBIR process. PJM will provide stakeholder education and its initial solution package and alternatives considered, including its option alternatives to stakeholders</p> <p>Stage 2 – Stakeholders may discuss any previously considered and/or new alternatives, with row-by-row reviews of the CIFP matrix.</p> <p>Stage 3 – Based on the row-by-row discussions, PJM will finalize its package, and stakeholders will create alternative packages as appropriate.</p> <p>Stage 4 – "Final Meeting": For the benefit of all meeting attendees, PJM will review its package proposal in the solution Matrix on a row-by-row basis to show how its solution addresses the PS/IC.
