PJM Announces Departure of Vince Duane to Pursue Other Opportunities*Christopher O'Hara assumes role of VP, General Counsel & Corporate Secretary*

(Valley Forge, Pa. – Nov. 11, 2019) – PJM announced today that Vince Duane, Senior Vice President, General Counsel and Corporate Secretary has decided to leave PJM. Effective immediately, Christopher O'Hara, currently Deputy General Counsel, will assume the role of Vice President, General Counsel & Corporate Secretary with responsibility for Law and Compliance.

"We are grateful to Vince for his many contributions to PJM and its stakeholders over the past 16 years," said Interim President and CEO Susan Riley. "As a member of the PJM Board of Managers, I worked with Vince from the time I joined the Board and have enormous respect for his legal perspective. The entire PJM community thanks Vince for his many contributions to PJM."

Duane joined the regional transmission organization in July 2003 and has managed a number of groups throughout the organization, including Legal, Compliance, Member Services and the Federal and State areas. Duane has also served as the chair of PJM Technologies, Inc. In previous years, he has served as the executive sponsor of Bridge, the African-American employee resource group.

"It has been my honor and privilege to serve PJM's employees and members for more than 16 years," Duane noted. "I am proud to have been part of such an outstanding team doing extremely important work, and I know PJM will continue to forge ahead with innovation, integrity and outstanding service to its members."

O'Hara joined PJM in April 2017 and has been managing the regulatory and commercial business needs of PJM. He has extensive experience in energy, litigation, regulatory affairs and compliance.
