

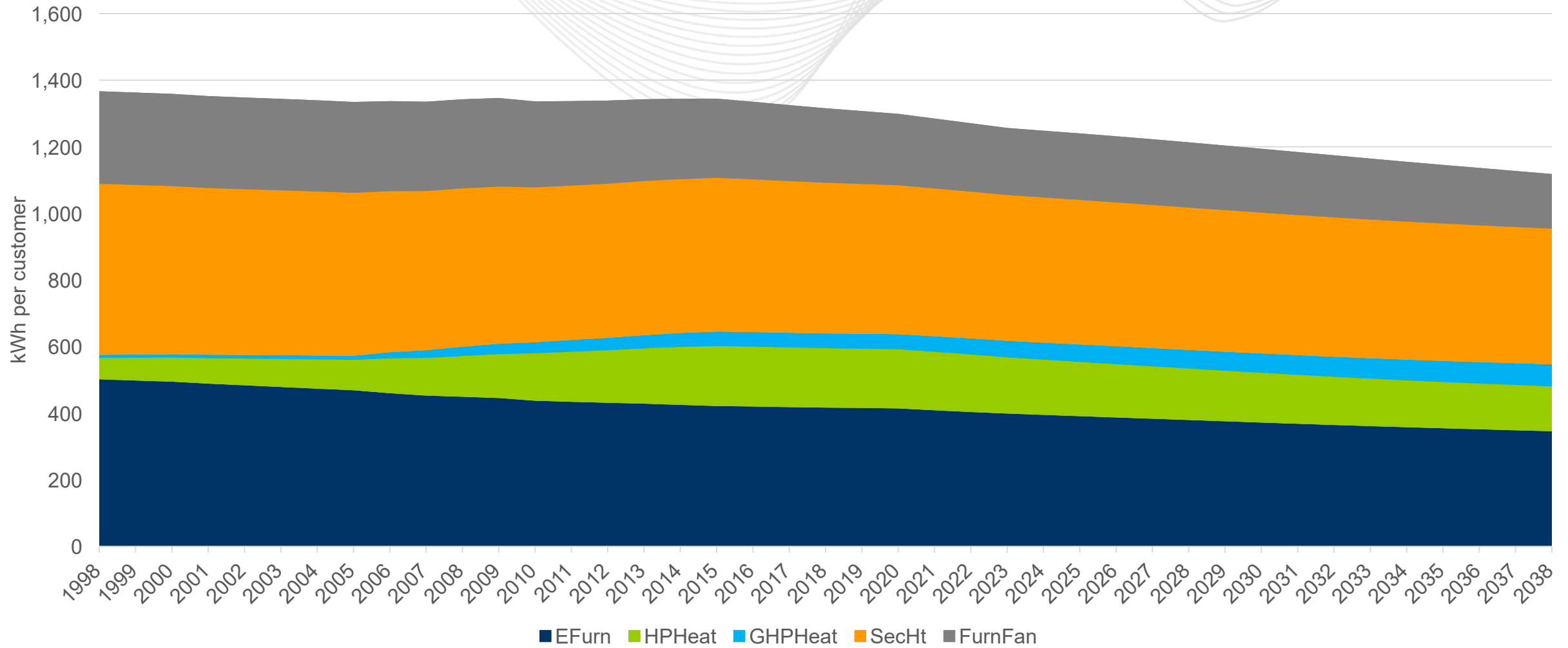
End-Use Input Variables

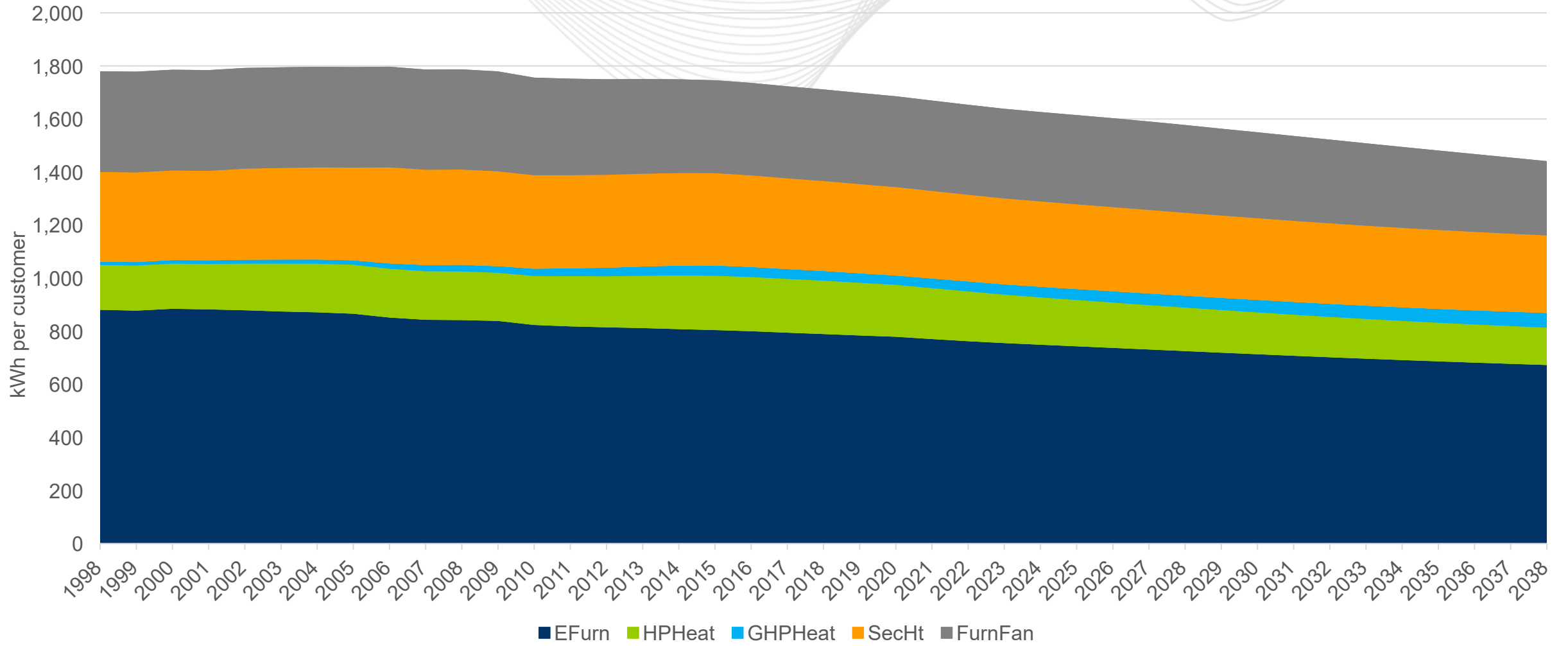
- PJM uses data obtained from Itron on end uses, which is drawn from data from the Energy Information Administration's 2022 Annual Energy Outlook.
- The following slides provide information on the various input history and forecasts for Residential and Commercial sectors by Census Division.
- Residential and Commercial data are intensities, which are the effects of appliance saturation adjusted for efficiency. For Residential this is expressed as kwh per customer. For Commercial this is expressed as kwh per square foot.

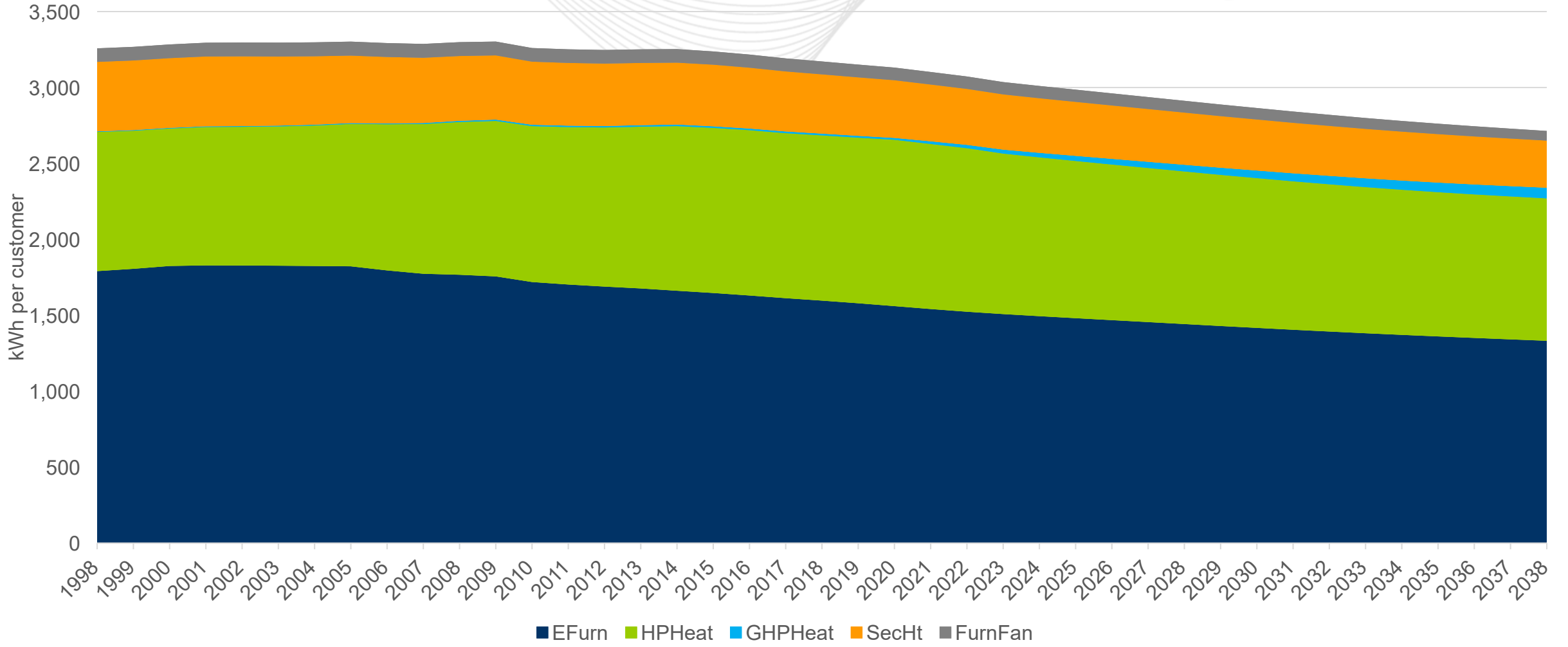


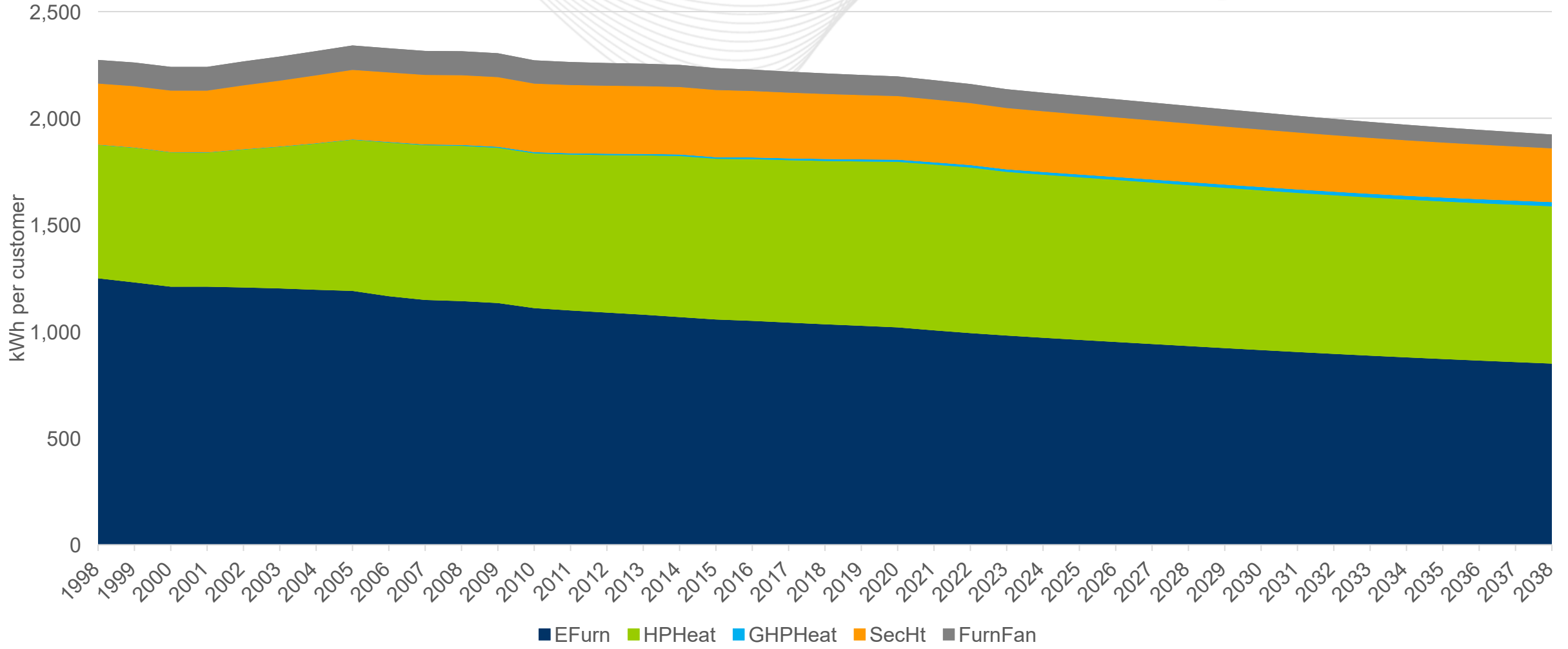

- Figures include building shell impacts





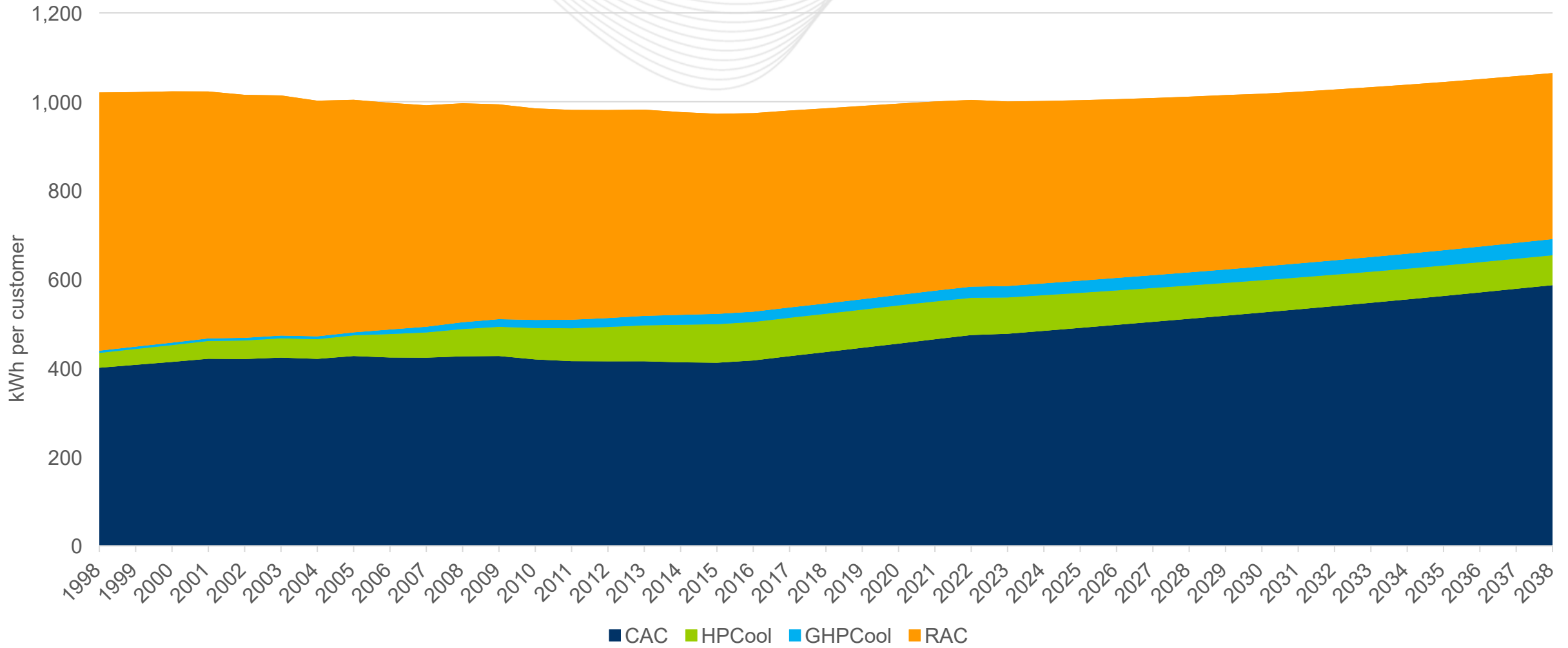


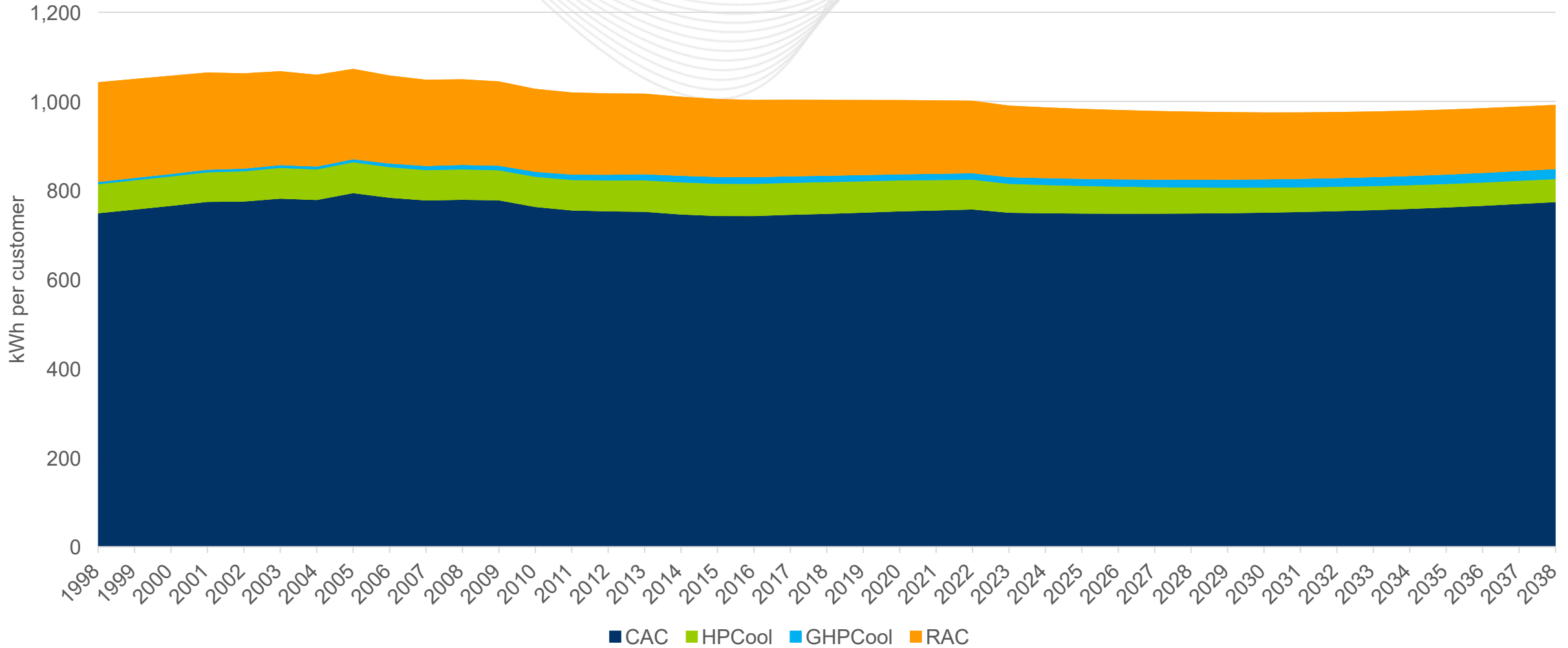


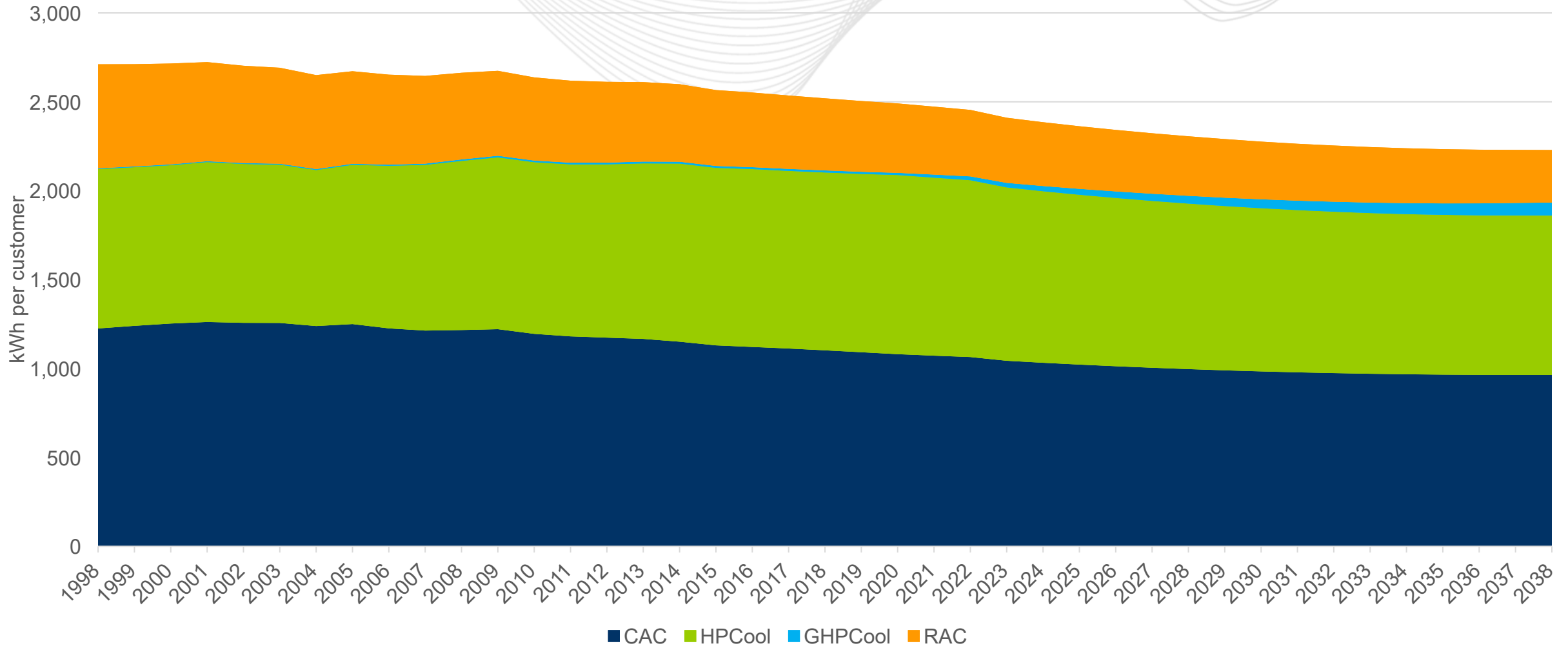


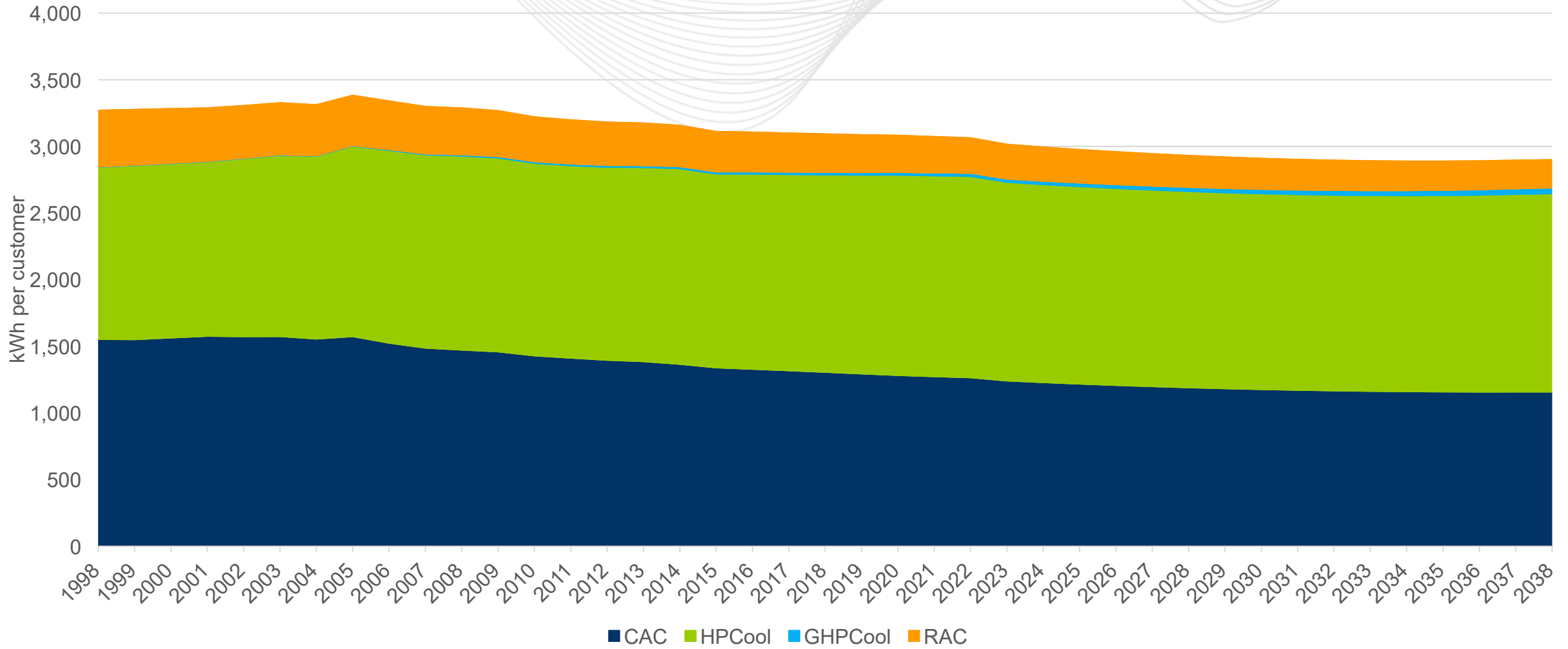
Residential: Cooling

- Figures include building shell impacts



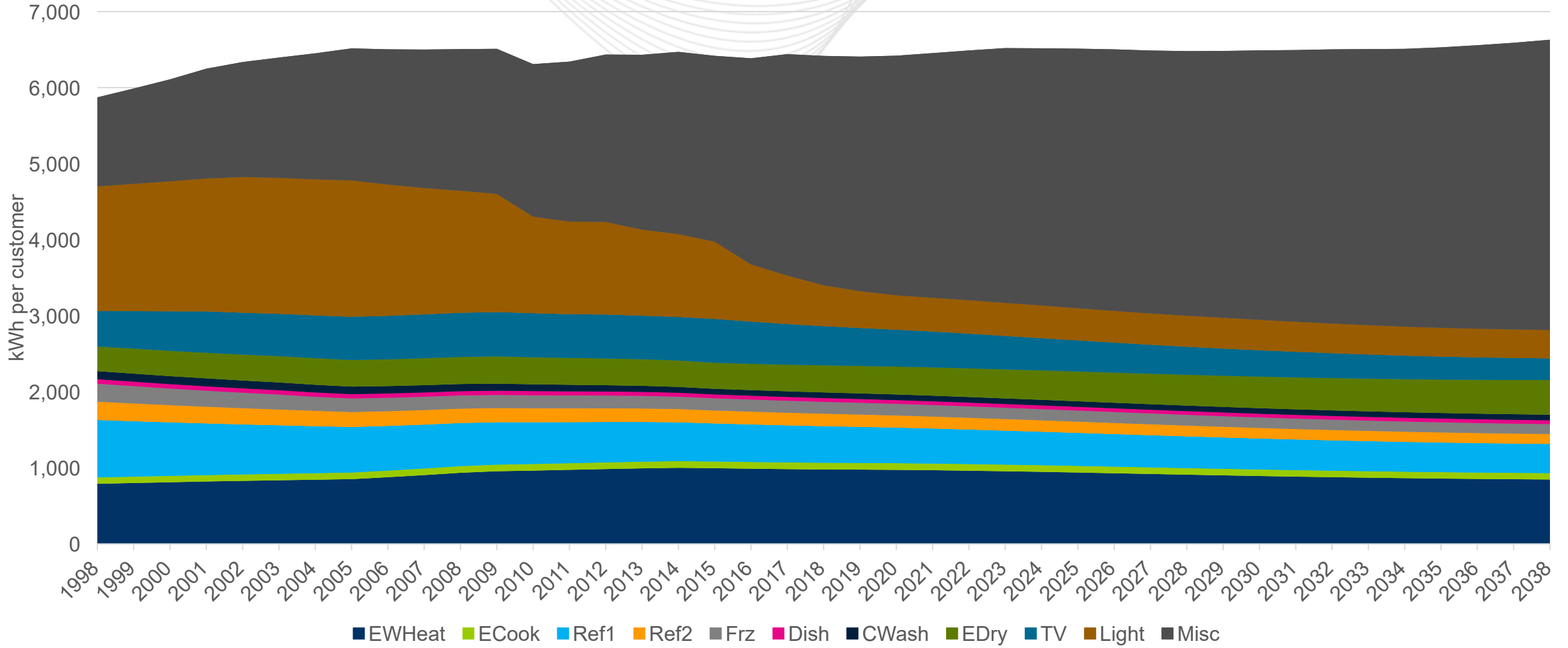


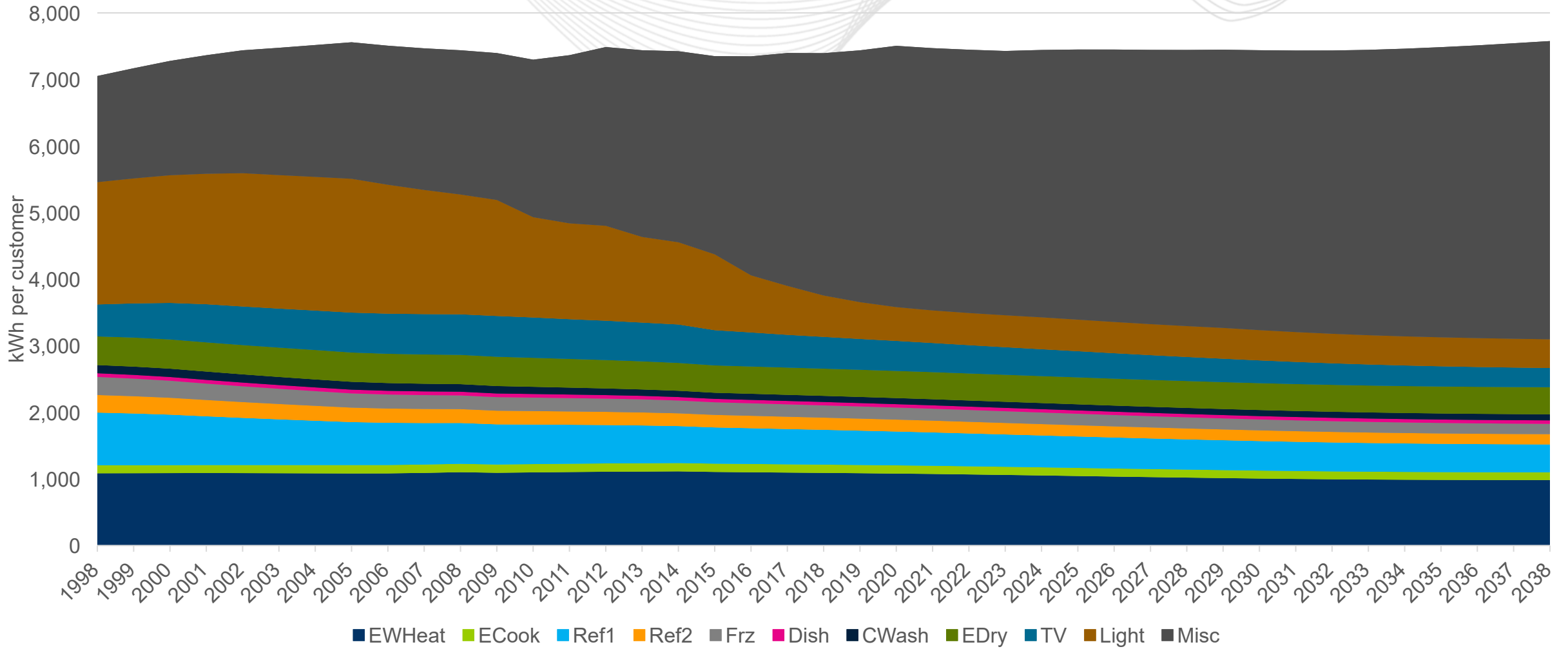


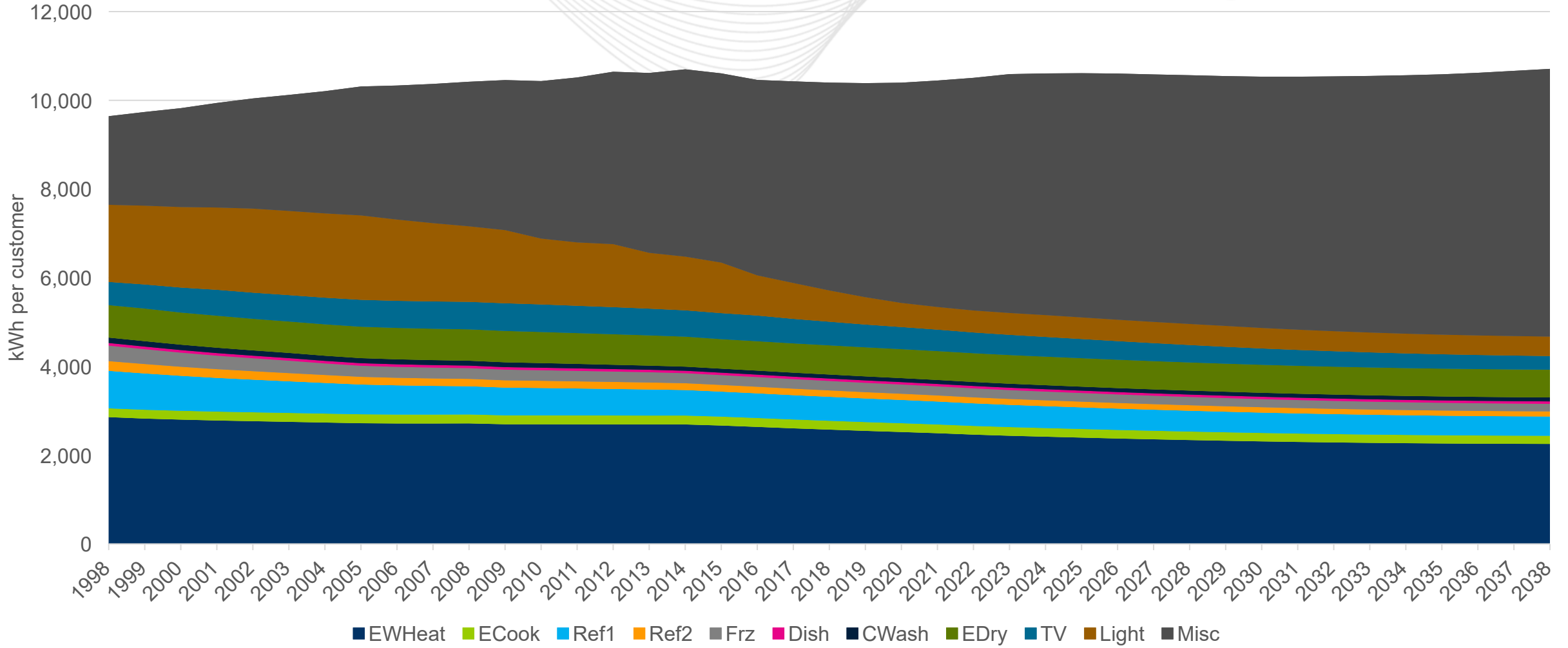


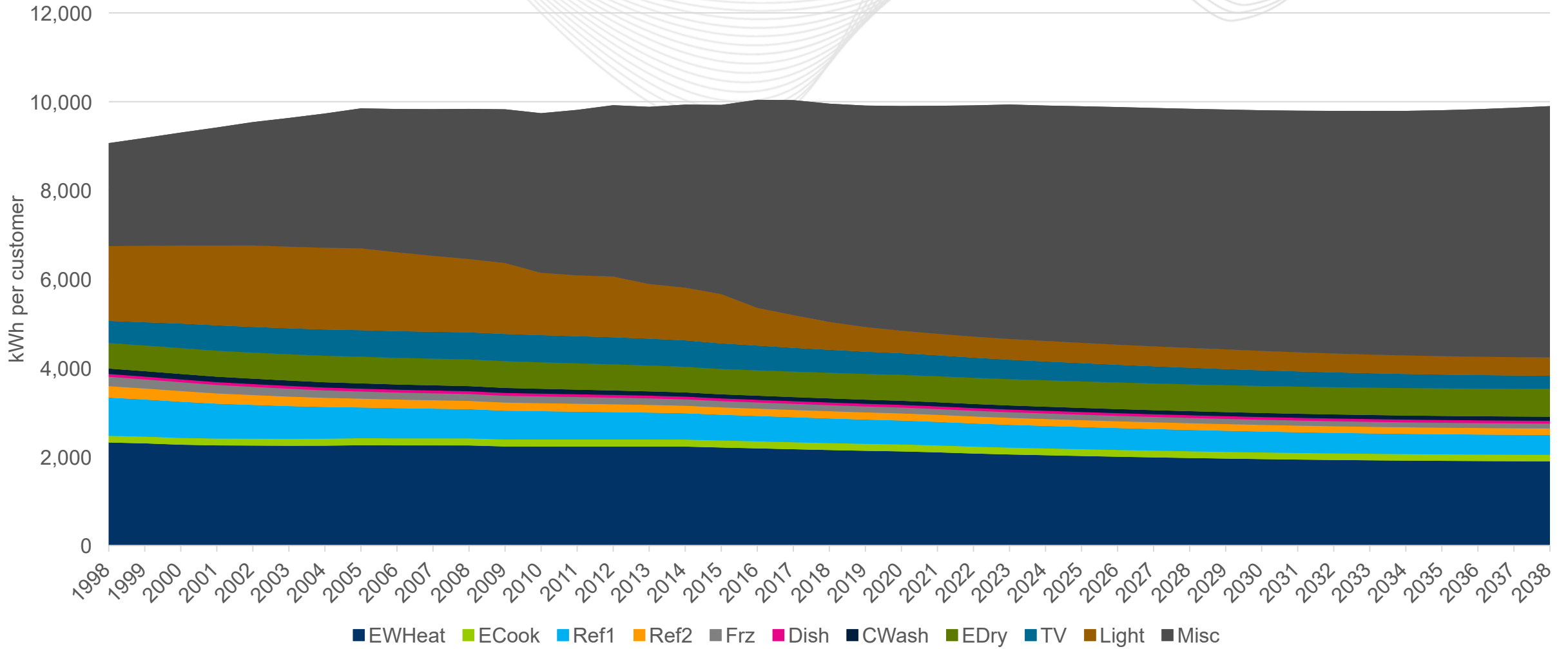

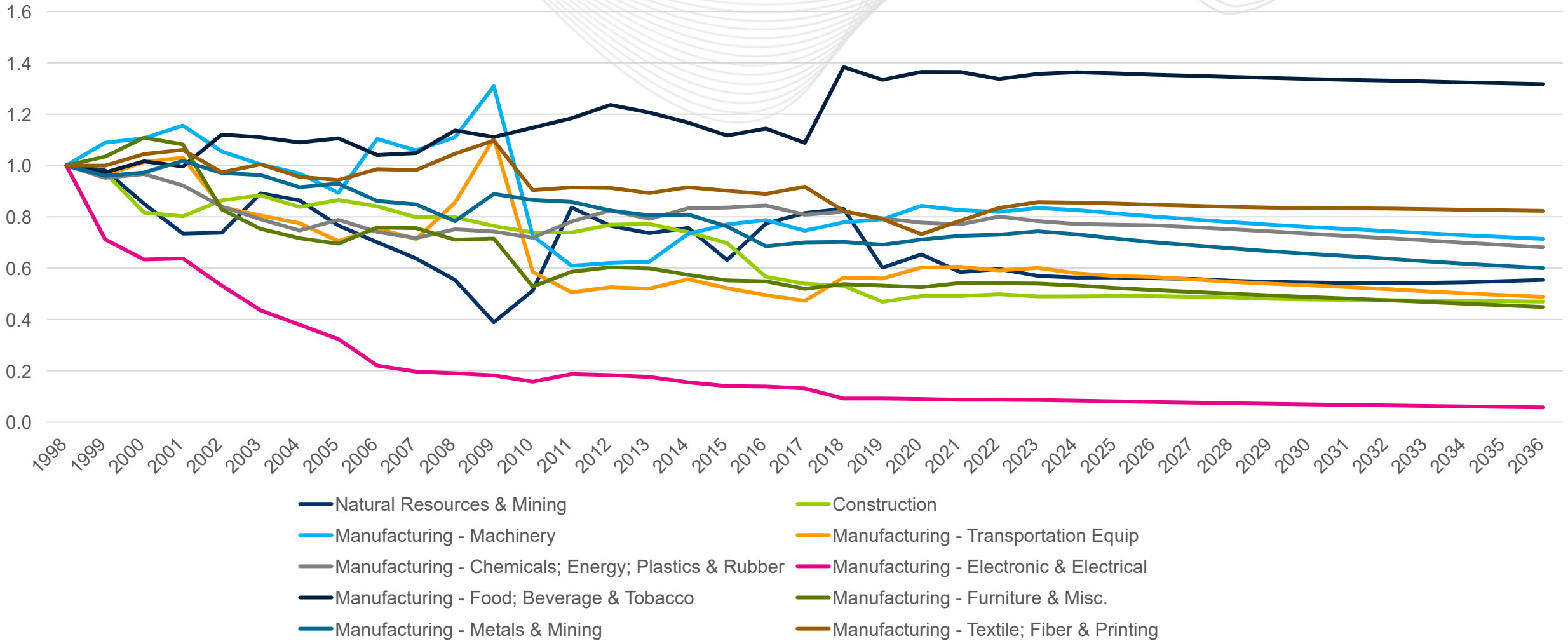


Industrial Intensity
